Title of the Practice

Imbibing traffic rules & regulations for road safety

Objectives

- 1. To assist in understanding the traffic rules and regulations
- 2. To avoid accidents and mishaps
- 3. To create awareness on safe driving for self and others
- 4. To provide training to keep a proper maintenance of the vehicle
- 5. To impart knowledge, to understand the symbols and signboards on the road

Context

Young people are more likely to be involved in traffic accidents and endure the resulting suffering, injuries, and fatalities. It is important to provide them with enough knowledge for safe driving, not only on a national but also at an international level. The organization contributes to a safe nation-building effort by working hand in hand with the National Road Safety Policy and the World Health Organization.

Many students from the nearby area commute by riding their own vehicles rather than using public transport. A piece of advice on these matters can save their lives.

Practice

The institution ensures upskilling the students about the traffic rules & regulations and necessary precautions while driving. This training has given relief to parents also, as they are always concerned about the safety of their wards when they are on the road.

Evidence

N.S.S has organized "SAFE RIDER Training Sessions" on different occasions. On 12th Oct 2021, the training session was attended by sixty-six students and on 25th March 2022, in another session, 90 students attended. The feedback got from the students revealed that they became aware of the significance of obeying the traffic rules and repercussions of not obeying them.

Problems encountered

Even though more students enrolled for the webinar, not all the students were able to attend the sessions.

BEST PRACTICE II

Title of the Practice

Tips to crack Competitive Exams

Objectives

- 1. To prepare the students to appear for the various competitive examinations
- 2. To enhance the skill set required for passing the exam
- 3. To provide knowledge and practice for the same

Context

Practice

On 26th July, 2021 the Competitive Examination Guidance Cell held an Orientation Programme for students. Reasoning, English Language, Quantitative Aptitude, Current Affairs & G.K., Financial Awareness, and Computer Application are just a few examples of the topics covered. Following the successful completion of the course, a Google form-based online test was conducted, and those students who passed were given e- certificates.
